Figure 7. DPA Lock Time Specification with DPA PLL Calibration Enabled



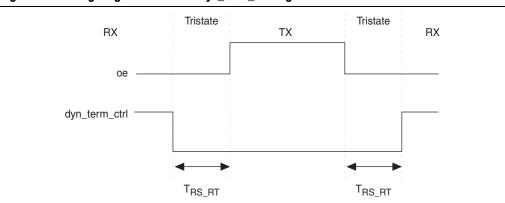

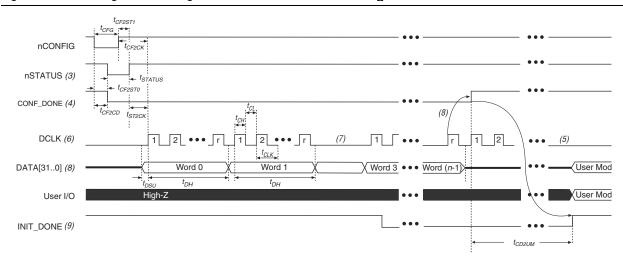


Figure 13. FPP Configuration Timing Waveform When the DCLK-to-DATA[] Ratio is >1 (1), (2)
